

Waiting list for subsidised residential care services for the elderly

- As at 30 June 2026, there were a total of 18 917 applicants being waitlisted for various types of subsidised residential care services (RCS) for the elderly in the Central Waiting List for subsidised long term care services. Details were as follows:

Waiting time

- With reference to information as at 30 June 2026, the average waiting times for various types of subsidised RCS for the elderly were as follows:

^{Note 1} To encourage ageing in place, elderly persons assessed and recommended for RCS will be given the choice of CCS if they wish to stay at home. Upon admission to CCS, their applications for RCS will be treated as “inactive”. Besides, applicants waitlisted for RCS may choose to change the status of their application to “Inactive” on their own accord. RCS applicants with “inactive” status will not be called for admission to RCS. These elderly persons may seek to re-activate their RCS option if there is a need in future. Once their applications are re-activated, these elderly persons will be called for admission to RCS when vacancies arise in accordance with their original application dates subject to valid assessment results. As at end of June 2026, there were 37 907 “inactive” applications.

^{Note 2} It is the average number of months taken between the waitlist date and the

admission date of normal cases admitted to service in the past three months. Cases accorded priority in allocation of places, those cases with inactive history admitted in the past three months, and cases transferred from home for the aged places to the converted care and attention places providing a continuum of care in the same residential care home for the elderly have been excluded in the calculation because their waiting time may be extraordinarily long or short in comparison with that of normal cases.

Note 3 Including subsidised nursing home places provided by subvented nursing homes, self-financing nursing homes and contract homes.
